NEW! YOUNG ALUMNI AWARD:

Celebrating Rising Stars in Chiropractic

This award recognizes a CMCC graduate who has been in practice for 10 years or less and is already making a powerful impact in the profession. Honourees exemplify excellence, leadership, and dedication through two or more of the following:

- Delivering exceptional patient care that goes above and beyond
- Actively contributing to chiropractic associations at the provincial and/or national level
- Making meaningful impacts to their communities while elevating the public profile of chiropractic
- Collaborating with fellow health care professionals to achieve outstanding patient outcomes
- Mentoring and empowering new graduates and/or chiropractic students
- Earning the highest respect and admiration from colleagues, staff, and peers

This award shines a spotlight on emerging leaders whose passion, professionalism, and commitment are shaping the future of chiropractic

CMCC ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR:

Presented to a practicing or retired chiropractor who exhibits some or all of the following qualities:

- Outstanding leadership and service to the chiropractic profession
- Operates a successful practice which is held in high regard in the local community
- Provides exceptional patient experiences with consistently positive outcomes
- Employs both clinical and administrative staff who speak very highly of the candidate
- Effectively and proactively collaborates with other health care professionals
- Mentors or is a role model to younger chiropractors
- Is a person of high integrity who has given positive direction to other people's lives
- Has helped build the stature, profile and reputation of the profession

COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARD:

Presented to a practicing or retired chiropractor who has dedicated much of their chiropractic career to helping local community organizations or marginalized populations outside of Canada and who has demonstrated some or all of the following qualities:

- Outstanding leadership and initiative in the community and has a positive impact on community projects
- Someone whose actions have made a lasting or meaningful impact on their community
- Has consistently demonstrated qualities of compassion, and service to one or more volunteer activities over an extended period
- Has enhancing the reputation and profile of the profession through community initiatives
- Gives freely and unselfishly of their time

PIONEER AWARD:

Presented to a practicing or retired chiropractor who has developed an innovative technique, procedure, technology, treatment, or educational program that has had a positive and lasting impact on both the profession and the patient. The pioneer award also recognizes excellence in research and is presented to the candidate who has demonstrated some or all of the following qualities:

- Successfully developed or has been a member of a development team responsible for one or more products which have significantly benefited colleagues or patients over an extended period of time
- Has authored educational materials such as textbooks, lab manuals, computer programs, audiovisual materials etc.
- Has developed programs to improve teaching methodologies
