BOARD MEMBER OF THE CANADIAN MEMORIAL CHIROPRACTIC COLLEGE APPOINTED MEMBER OF THE ORDER OF CANADA

Toronto, January 15, 2002—

Laurent Isabelle who joined the Board of Governors of the Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC) in 1991 was among yesterday's 96 appointments to the Order of Canada made by Her Excellency the Right Honourable Adrienne Clarkson, Governor General of Canada.

President of CMCC, Dr. Jean Moss, offered her congratulations to Dr. Isabelle, a strong supporter of CMCC and of chiropractic: "All of us at the College are very happy for Laurent. This is recognition he strongly deserves. He is a tireless advocate on behalf of education, chiropractic, and CMCC."

Throughout his career, Dr. Isabelle has defended the rights of Francophones, particularly in the area of education. A former professor and director of the University of Ottawa Guidance Centre, he is also a past president of Algonquin College. A founding member of the Conseil d'éducation franco-ontarienne, he has been involved in many organizations, including the Association canadienne-française de l'Ontario and the Fondation Richelieu International. A dedicated volunteer, he has demonstrated exemplary leadership in connection with local hospitals and currently serves on several boards including CMCC.

From local citizens to national and international personalities, all Canadians are eligible for the Order of Canada, the country's highest honour for lifetime achievement. Three different levels of membership honour people whose accomplishments vary in degree and scope: Companion, Officer and Member. Appointments are made on the recommendation of an Advisory Council, chaired by the Chief Justice of Canada. The Governor General is the Chancellor and Principal Companion of the Order.
