154 STUDENTS GRADUATE, 3 SENIOR FACULTY MEMBERS BID FARWELL AT CMCC CONVOCATION

Canadian Memorial Chiropractic College (CMCC) is proud to announce that graduation day has arrived for the Class of 2002. On Friday, May 3, after four years of intensive study and clinical training, 151 graduates hailing from across Canada and around the world walked across the stage at Convocation Hall, University of Toronto, to receive their Doctor of Chiropractic diplomas. Faculty Retirement: Dr. Herbert K. Lee and Dr. Henry Morrison

In his 93rd year, and after a career that has spanned six decades, Dr. Herb Lee has announced his retirement. One of the founding members of CMCC, Dr. Lee offered these words at convocation, "As the only living member of the small committee that did the preliminary work to establish CMCC, it gives me a great deal of pleasure and satisfaction to view this fine graduation class today and look back at all the earlier classes that have graduated before you. CMCC has indeed been successful in graduating many excellent and ethical chiropractors during its 57 year history."

This year will also be the last convocation for Dr. Henry Morrison. A 1967 graduate of CMCC, and a member of faculty since 1973, Dr. Morrison, in the words of Dr. John Mrozek, Dean, Undergraduate Studies, "has been an integral part of the College family and has contributed to the clinical education of over two thousand graduates. In addition, he has contributed to numerous committees and subcommittees of the Canadian Chiropractic Association and the regulatory College of the Province of Ontario. We wish him all the best in his retirement."

Faculty Changes: Dr Stefan Pallister moving "Down Under"

Graduation keynote speaker was Dr. Stefan Pallister, Registrar. Dr. Pallister has accepted a new position as Foundation Professor of Chiropractic and the Head of School of Chiropractic at Murdoch University in Western Australia. A CMCC graduate in 1968, Dr. Pallister joined CMCC as a faculty member in 1988. "Dr. Pallister will be greatly missed," said Dr. Jean Moss, President of CMCC.
